Seminar on Applications of Membrane-type Elastic Meta-material on Indoor Acoustics 13 January 2018

A seminar on the "Applications of Membrane-type Elastic Meta-material on Indoor Acoustics" organized by the HKIOA Indoor Acoustic Sub-committee was successfully held on 13 January 2018 (Saturday) at the University of Science and Technology.

The speaker, Professor Jason Yang, Zhi Yu, the Professor of Department of Physics, and the Environmental Science Program at UST, gave the participants a very inspiring and in-depth talk about decorated membrane resonators and its application. These metamaterials have a vast range of applications in residential and commercial buildings, etc.

Overall, the seminar was well received by over 30 participants from different sectors, the government department, consultants and project proponents, and it helped spread the acoustical knowledge to professionals.

Joint HKIOA, HKIE-MMNC and PolyU Seminar Challenge of Fan Noise Reduction for Home Appliances 2 February, 2018

A seminar on "Challenge of Fan Noise Reduction for Home Appliances" organized by HKIOA, HKIE-MMNC Division and the Department of Mechanical Engineering of PolyU was held on the 2nd February, 2018.

Dr. Ian Y. W. Wong, Vice President – Strategic Business Development of Raymond Industrial Limited, shared a novel method to identify and reduce the noise associated with home appliances such as hair dryer, wall fan, air purifier, humidifier and dehumidifier, etc.

In this seminar, recent application of hybrid aeroacoustic simulation on the reduction of noise generated by fan installed in home appliances was presented. Study of fan noise using this method having a benefit of the easy differentiation noise propagation from flow generation which allows accurate prediction of noise level at various fan operation requirements. Such capability allows the feasibility of the difficult fan noise generation study conducts in an accurate virtual platform, and fan design optimization under contradictory requirements of low noise yet high volume flow rate of the product. As a new insight for home appliance industry, fan design for air purifier was described as an illustration of how to optimize it under difficult requirements.

After the sharing, some of the students continued the discussion with the guests and completed the event with a satisfying face.
















Certificate Course Presentation Ceremony cum Tea Gathering 10 March, 2018







